God called Don Worch home on October 7, at age 90. He was born in Dayton, OH and received Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at age 9.

Don attended Bob Jones University, preparing for full time Christian service. There he met and married Nan Clark. Don and Nan celebrated their 68th anniversary on August 26, 2019. They ministered together, first as he pastored three churches, and then at the Baptist Children's Home.

Don left the pastorate to become President of the Baptist Children's Home in 1967 where he served until his retirement in 1994. He


touched thousands of lives and was always glad to hear later of how the Lord had made great changes and restored families through the

ministry of BCH. His love of children and the importance of the family knew no bounds, and he worked tirelessly to see children loved and cared for and families restored.

At his funeral, many shared tributes of Don's ministry in their lives. The following excerpts will give you a glimpse into the many ways he cared for people.

<u>David Cieply</u> (Grandson) – "I did not have a Grandpa; I had a *Papaw*, and a Papaw is a pretty wonderful thing. I am not sad because he is gone, because

I know his suffering is over, and he is in glory. I am sad because I have to wait so long until I see

<u>Linda Bradley</u> (Adoptive Mother) – "I am thankful for the adoption ministry of the Baptist Children's Home. Don handed us our daughter Kristen and a year later, Jason. They rescued these babies and entrusted them to us. I am thankful to say that those babies are 42 & 43 years old and know the Lord and are pointing their families to Christ. Garry and I are eternally grateful."

Gaylon Worch (Brother) "Don was also a great negotiator. He negotiated with me, and I lost. He wanted his back scratched. He started paying me a penny a minute to rub his

back. Finally I grew a little bit smarter and said, "No." So he said, "How about two cents?" and I said okay. He finally got to a dime a minute, and so I consider that my first job in life."

<u>Cindy Hamilton</u> (Former BCH child) I am the oldest of seven kids. Our church contacted the Children's Home and said "We have these kids to place." I can say Uncle Don and Aunt Nan went above and beyond. They moved out of their house so that we could be together.

We were the first group home. My mom's dying wish was that we could all be together. I thank you so much for the opportunity to grow up to be safe, to pursue dreams, and to ripple out into the lives of others.



<u>Les Anderson</u> (former BCH resident) –I was four years old when my dad dropped me and my two brothers off at the Children's Home in Kouts. I remember so many memories of Uncle Don. Even as a little boy, I would go into his office and play. He would sit down with us and read a book. **Through the years when we would see Uncle Don and Aunt Nan, we were always treated like family.**

I was a pastor in Michigan, and Uncle Don sat on my ordination council and then preached my ordination service. That was something I will never forget. Because of the ministry of Uncle Don and the Children's Home, I got a dad (John Mixon) that I never had.

<u>Carrie Santner</u> – I am a friend of the Worch family. I am speaking to share with you how far spread his

ministry went in this community. I was a hairdresser coming to Valparaiso in 1981. Nineteen years old at the time, and very much not a Christian. I grew in my relationship with the Worches because God placed them in my chair. A year later my husband had open heart surgery. Because my husband's surgery was December 23, 1986, the Worches came to the hospital and decorated our room with a Christmas tree. They brought Christmas to the hospital room.

But the most important thing that happened was that Don & Nan visited us the night before his surgery. Don prayed that prayer with me that led me to the Lord while our pastor was in John's intensive care room praying with him. A very pivotal

point in our lives. But Don didn't stop there; he continued to feed truth into my life, offering me much wisdom. I want to thank the Worch family for the path that my family is on right now.

<u>Rachel Cieply</u> – I am the oldest granddaughter, and through this whole process one thing that has been on my heart is legacy and the legacy that my grandfather has laid down. Today I am realizing the impact that he has had and how far stretched his love has reached, I've never been more proud to be in the family that I'm in. We all know that he could preach a sermon like no other. But he could also influence lives just in small little comments every day that you didn't even realize that he was preaching to you.

When I was 16, we went to India to visit Pastor Abraham. At the time I had wanted to be veterinarian. I had a lot of compassion in my heart. Because of that, during my time in India, I realized that I really loved kids. I really loved kids. During that trip I decided that I didn't want to be a veterinarian anymore. I wanted to be a nurse. I became a pediatric nurse, and I work in cardiology. So I take care of little babies with heart defects. And I truly believe that is part of the legacy that my Papaw has instilled in me.

<u>Sandi Nihart</u> (Former BCH resident) "I was thankful for Don Worch before I ever met him. We lived in CA and were at church one day. The pastor told my dad about a children's home in IN. My dad was an abusive father.

On our way home he told me and my two little sisters that he was going to call the Children's Home, and he was going to tell them that we were very naughty bad girls. He would ask if the Children's Home would take us. He told us that they would probably say "No" and when they said no, we would be in big trouble. Sure enough, my dad called the Children's Home. Don Worch answered the phone.

We three girls stood while my dad told Don Worch what terrible children we were and why he (Don) wouldn't want us. My dad held the phone out after he said, "Would you be interested in taking them?" I heard Don Worch say, "Let me tell you, sir, let me tell you something. We'll take them."

And then my dad said, "Will you even take the *really naughty 13-year old?*" That was me. And Don Worch said again, "**Let me tell you sir. I said we will take them all.**" He might have been the President or the Director, but to us he was just Uncle Don, and we knew that he loved us.

He gave undeserved second chances. He saw the best in people. And he encouraged them to start again and walk with God. He was a cheerleader for the fatherless. He invested himself in lives by giving biblical counsel and exhortation that were life-changing. In short, the life of Uncle Don was characterized by the Fruit of the Spirit. He was a man whose heart was full to overflowing.

<u>Debbie Goode</u> – I first met Uncle Don as Pastor Don. I was at Aetna Baptist. I lived in a very dysfunctional home and I was invited to go to church in 1965 by my friend. I accepted the Lord July 17, 1966. Uncle Don was the one who led me to the Lord.

I think he had some idea of what was going on in our home. While others were sad that Pastor Don was leaving us (our church), little did I know that the Lord had a plan for me in that move. There came a day when my mom had to go to court for child neglect. My new pastor went with my mom to court.

I can remember sitting outside the courthouse in Gary with the two big domes, that I still pass quite often as I'm going into Chicago. My mom and my pastor came out and said we would be taken away, it was just a matter of where we would go. Pastor said "I'll ask the judge if I can take you out on a visit to the Baptist Children's Home in Kouts."

We made that trip and he said, "Well, what do you think?" Well, that was a no-brainer for me. I was now a child of God and I wanted to be in a place that was going to support my faith, and it also gave me an opportunity that my brothers and I would stay together. Now I learned to know Don Worch, not as my pastor, but as Uncle Don who was overseeing the ministry.
